Paired Programming for Success – Grade 9 & 10 Program (Semester 1)

The grade 9 program pairs PAL 10 (large group activities) and CHV2O/GLC2O (careers/civics).



PERSPECTIVE ON ALLIANCE ACADEMY OPPORTUNITY

Scenario - Tournament in Toronto

Drive to Toronto - 7.5 hours each way
Play 3-4 games (32 minute games)
128 minutes total game time
Good players play 80 % of the time or 102 minutes
Average player plays 50 % of the time or 64 minutes
Cost for hotels, gas, food, entry, etc. - \$1000.00 +



- 75 minutes of training/development per day
- 92 school days per semester
- 6,900 hours of training in a semester
- Average player gets 5-7 shots a game where in the skills academy they can get 250 shots in a single class
- Competition is important but the value of this opportunity is undeniable!


